# Literacy Snapshot \_\_\_\_\_

#### What:

At Immaculate Heart, our goal is for every child to achieve reading success.

#### How:

To continue to help our students build their knowledge and develop their skills to become Literate Learners for Life! Our whole school approach to Literacy is based on The Science of Learning, the most up to date research!

Our Early Years Students have started their InitiaLit journey for the year with daily sequential interactive lessons. InitiaLit is an evidence-based whole-class literacy program for Prep to Grade 2 students providing all children with the essential core knowledge and strong foundations to become successful readers and writers. InitiaLit is a three-year program, teaching of phonics alongside a rich literature and vocabulary component.

Our Primary classes will continue to grow their knowledge of words, sounds and their meaning in daily Spelling Mastery sessions. Spelling Mastery provides direct instructional lessons to effectively and

efficiently teach the spelling skills students need to become proficient readers and writers. Our students enthusiastically started this paced, interactive and sequential program for the year.

Grades 4-6, have also started their Novel Study for the term, supported by evidence-based strategies. 'This rich literature supports learning parts of speech, grammar, vocabulary, and supports writing for a purpose.







We encourage you to ask your child what they have been learning in Literacy this week!

## Grade 7 Enrolments

As part of the enrolment process for Catholic Secondary Colleges for Grade 7 in 2026, parents are asked to submit enrolment applications to their preferred secondary school by 14 March 2025. This includes enrolments to Sacred Heart College. To complete this, you must contact the school of your preference.

We are happy to support families with enrolment enquiries and help you with the application process if needed.

#### NAPLAN 2025

#### Students will be sitting NAPLAN between 12 and 24 March 2025.

The National Assessment Program-Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are already learning at school. On its own, NAPLAN is not a test that can be studied for, and students are not expected to do so.

NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process – it does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance; however, students and parents may use individual results to discuss progress with teachers.

NAPLAN has been held in March since 2023, having previously taken place in May. This change was made so school systems would have access to results earlier in the school year. These results can then be used to inform teaching and learning plans for the remainder of the year.

#### Why NAPLAN is conducted online

NAPLAN online provides a better assessment and more precise results.

One of the main benefits of NAPLAN online is that it uses tailored (or adaptive) testing. This means that students receive questions better suited to their abilities, so they can show what they know and can do.

Online testing also allows us to provide a wide range of accessibility options to support students with disability to access NAPLAN.

Feedback from students is that they find the online test more engaging.

Please note that students in Year 3 complete the Writing Test on paper.


