### **Prayer for Pope Leo XIV**


Faithful God, You guide us on the path of life and your goodness is our constant companion.

# Classroom Heartbeat

### Grade 3

Last week, as part of our science unit this term, Grade 3 went to Bonorong Wildlife Park to learn about how the external features of animals help us to classify them into groups. We saw wombats, Tasmanian devils, kangaroos, wallabies and lots of birds – including a Cape Barren Goose called Lucy. It was interesting to find out about wombats' homes, marsupials' pouches and what people are doing to save the Tasmanian Devil from a terrible disease.

### Grade 7 Enrolments – Final Reminder

Nurturing Hearts is Immaculate Heart of Mary's Early Learning Program for children aged from Birth to Five and their families and endorsed by Catholic Education Tasmania's 'Set Up for Success' initiative. Our weekly program invites children to engage in fun 'hands-on' learning experiences that support their developing interests, encourage exploration, discovery and interaction, and help children to begin to make sense of their world. Simultaneously, we support parents in their role as the primary educators of their child to better understand the importance of early learning and childhood development in the critical first 1000 days, giving their child the best possible start to their learning. Our wonderful community of little learners and their families is also a special place to build connections to our school and staff, and to forge enduring friendships with other families!

Each Nurturing Hearts session is planned using the national Early Years Learning Framework and incorporates a wide variety of learning invitations and play provocations to specifically develop children's early Literacy Skills and Vocabulary-Building, Social Skills and Regulation, Mathematical Understanding, Fine Motor Skills and Hand-Eye Coordination, Gross Motor Skills and Muscle Strengthening, Problem-Solving and Cognitive Skills, and their Concentration, Attention and Memory all at an age-appropriate level and pace.



Each term we explore a broad theme or interest and, this term, our learning and play experiences encourage children to develop an interest in and understanding of Nursery Rhymes, while supporting their families with ideas and information to build their child's language, literacy and brain development through rhythm & rhyme.

We warmly invite families in our local community, with a child aged from birth to five, to join Mrs Brook and Mrs Wall on Friday mornings, from 9:00-10:30am in our Kindergarten space! (And if your own children are a little too old for our program, feel free to bring along a younger niece or nephew!)

### Progress to date:

- Footings and excavations are ongoing to ramps, stair footings & lift shaft base
- Pouring of footing continuing
- Structural steelwork installation to internal of building complete
- Stormwater drainage installation complete
- Wall framing well advanced
- Rafter installation well advanced
- Stormwater drainage complete
- Window frame installation practically complete
- Agg drain to rear of server room installed. Lower ramp blockwork walls laid

### Progress to next fortnight:

- Wall framing complete
- Rafter & truss installation complete
- Timber floor frame well advanced
- Glazing installation underway
- Window frame installation complete
- Rough-in works to electrical, plumbing & mechanical underway
- Civil works continuing

The next site meeting is on 22nd May.
