Transformation of the Heart Fly Through

The next site meeting is set for tomorrow 14 August.

Progress to date:

- Blockwork to lift shaft & ramps is practically complete
- Block 2 handed back to school for occupation
- Plastering works continuing with ceiling insulation, sisalation paper & ceiling grid.
- Structural steel for the courtyard and suspended slab area is practically complete
- Footings for stairs and retaining walls in the middle section are practically complete

Progress to next fortnight:

- Plastering works
- Deck for suspended slab underway
- Excavation for footings continuing
- Ceiling lining and plastering continuing
- Gutter replacement underway

These arrangements are in place to prioritise the safety of all students and adults, all day, every day:

- Restricted Access: Entry from McCann Crescent is now restricted.

- Kiss and Drop Zone: This will be relocated to Edge Avenue at this time of the year.
