Loving God,


We thank you for the rich culture, deep spirituality, and ancient wisdom of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples.

# Transformation of the Heart - Capital Works Building Project\_

We're excited to share that our building project is progressing well and is now 55% complete. The site is almost completely "out of the ground" – meaning the major excavation and concrete works are behind us.

A significant amount of progress was made over the school holidays. The framework is taking shape, with the roofing structure now in place, the doors to the new Grade 3/4 learning spaces installed, and substantial progress made on both the access ramp and the elevator shaft.

As the project continues this term, there will be occasional changes to how students access some classrooms. At times, entry to the Prep and Grade 4 areas may be redirected via the canteen. We'll ensure families are given as much notice as possible ahead of these changes to minimise disruption.

Thank you for your continued support and patience as we work to bring these exciting new facilities to life for our school community. This transformation of our learning spaces reflects our commitment to ongoing growth and connection as a community, creating places that inspire learning, belonging, and shared purpose.

The next site meeting is set for tomorrow 31 July.

The following arrangements are in place to prioritise the safety of all students and adults, all day, every day:

- Restricted Access: Entry from McCann Crescent is now restricted.
- We have moved our Van and Bus back to McCann Cresent - as it was too tricky for everyone on Edge Avenue
- Staff Car Park: Access to the staff car park will be limited during school hours.
- Kiss and Drop Zone: This will be relocated to Edge Avenue at this time of the year.
- Pedestrian Access: All students and adults entering on foot through the staff car park must use the designated pathways.
- Assistance: If you require help accessing the school, please contact the school office.
- Blue Astro Court 8:30 8:45am: To support safe access, kicking games will be restricted during this time as the Blue Court will be a major thoroughfare.







# Catholic Education Mental Health Support Survey

Catholic Education Tasmania (CET) is undertaking an independent Review of Mental Health Supports, facilitated by Altum Counselling and Consulting Pty Ltd. The review is evaluating how well current mental health and wellbeing supports are provided across CET schools and how they reflect our Catholic mission and commitment to care.


- Each student to have their Lego creation completed and ready for judging to your school or group by Monday 8<sup>th</sup> Sept 2025.


In a second lesson, students participated in teamwork games. They worked in small groups and competed against other teams.
